Big enough to accommodate numerous award-winning restaurants and hotels of worldwide reputation, Malmö offers you an abundance of superb choices, all within walking distance. You will find restaurants, café's, bars, attractions and shops, all easily accessible and close together. The hotels in Malmö are all of a very high standard, with rooms of various types and sizes. Many of them have been renovated in recent years. Two of the best hotels Malmö can offer are the trendy *Best Western Mäster Johan Hotel* and the *Radisson SAS Hotel*



The young and trendy restaurants *Vanilj* and *Thott's Restaurant*, serves a large variety of interesting food covering everything from Swedish traditional dishes to modern cuisine. They are also two of the most popular restaurants in Malmö

Other trendy restaurants include *Lemongrass* - distinctive, modern dishes inspired by a range of different Asian cooking traditions. Tranquil and elegant interior design. Restaurants like *Victors bar*, *Mello Yello*, *Moosehead* and *Izakaya Koi* are also worth trying.

Lilla Torg is Malmö's most picturesque square, surrounded by restaurants, bars and open-air cafés. If you want an ocean view you should visit *Salt & Brygga* in the new city district in the Western harbour area. The view over Öresund is magnificent. Salt & Brygga subscribes to an eco-friendly concept, from the furnishings to the cooking. This is a non-smoking restaurant offering innovative international cuisine.



Nightlife and Shopping in Malmö

Malmö offers a wide range of nightlife options. If you visit places like Lilla Torg or Möllevångstorget, you'll find several different bars and restaurants where the young and trendy hang out. If you are looking for nightclubs, Malmö has the biggest nightclub in Scandinavia – *Slagthuset*, offering three dance floors and four bars. Other nightclubs include *Étage*, *Hipp* and *KB*.

Large department stores, shopping centres and small, fashionable boutiques can all be found within easy walking distance of one another. Visitors can find virtually anything here; bookstores, antique shops, shops selling glassware, arts and crafts, design shops, sports stores and much more. Casino Cosmopol
